Wesley's Chapel and the Museum of Methodism are looking for an experienced and skilled exhibition and learning project officer. Your task will be to help the project team develop and deliver a major Methodist history exhibition, an oral history project and an associated learning programme on time and budget.

'Leadership on a Journey': A Celebration of the Contribution of black, Asian and minority ethnic Methodists to the Life of the Church', will seek to inspire reflection on how leadership of black, Asian and minority ethnic Methodists has helped to shape the Church, and how this leadership may be nurtured today. Longer term, the resources accompanying the display will help resource the evangelism and faith journeys of British Methodists from around the Connexion, and help represent the rich diversity of Methodist life and action for all church and museum visitors. The exhibition will run between 5th September 2021 and through Black History month until 26th Nov 2021.

As an inclusive organisation, applications from people of all backgrounds are welcome and encouraged. The appointment requires sympathy for the general goals and ethos of the Methodist Church. Knowledge of working with places of worship would be an advantage but is not essential. Part-time appointments will be considered.
